

Post Election 2016

The election came and went without a result. At time of writing, counting is still underway. As of now, it looks as though the Coalition has the numbers to maintain government, with a 73-66 lead over the labor party, with 76 the required number to maintain a majority government. Otherwise there will be a minority government with a hung parliament. This will require

negotiation with minor parties to form a government. This election has taught the coalition a great deal. There is still the possibility of a hung parliament meaning Malcom Turnbull will have to wheel and deal with the minor parties and independents. As we all know Turnbull called a double dissolution election in the hopes of clearing the senate of independents and minor parties. He did not take into account the disenchantment people have towards mainstream politics and parties.

The senate will now be inundated with senators from minor parties which is exactly what Turnbull was trying to avoid. In some good news for Christians as a whole, the Christian Democratic Party (CDP) is still a possibility of gaining a spot in the Upper House. This will be important in regards to decisions and laws being passed through the senate over the next 3 years. What does this mean with regards to bills and legislation being passed? Well for one, it will make it a lot more difficult for the Coalition government to get any bills they want to push through. This is exactly what Turnbull was hoping he would avoid, but alas he has failed in this regard. According to the ABC website on the election the Coalition has 35.4% of the senate votes in the nation, while Labor has 30.3%. If we look at the Christian parties numbers: the CDP has 1.2% in the senate and 1.4% in the House of Rep. Family

If these major christian parties collaborated together the number of votes they received would have had more of a significant meaning to them. They would have close to 4% of the vote in the senate. Which is equal to that of Pauline Hanson's party One Nation who are

line to receive 3 senate seats. This would have made a difference in how the debate to same-sex marriage would be fought. We need to be unified in this fight for our freedom, otherwise we will ultimately fail.

The people in all Western countries are leading a revolt against the tyranny of stultifying political correctness. This is evident with Brexit, the rise of Donald Trump, and here in Australia by the rise of minor parties, including Pauline Hanson. Recently at the abortion mill on Devonshire St, Surry Hills a mother arrived with her friend for an abortion. It was a typical day at the mill, one of our counsellors was there providing counsel to women going in. The prayers' were there praying in reparation for the sins of abortion as well as the conversion of the hearts of the mothers and fathers going in. The counsellor noticed a lady and her friend walking towards the clinic. He approached them and they stopped and listened to him. As usual, the counsellor told them that this place is not the answer and that it will not help you and it will most certainly not help the unborn child.

After speaking with them for a little bit they moved away and walked down the street just to think about things for awhile. It was while talking that the counsellor found out that she was an Iranian refugee and that her friend was from Somalia. The mother though, was extremely worried about what her boyfriend would think as he wanted her to have the abortion. This is the case for a lot of these poor women that are in these situations.

After much consideration she decided against having an abortion and to keep the baby. Her friend was a great influence on this decision. After having an abortion previously, she knew exactly why it was the wrong choice. We organised for her to meet with an obstetrician who has worked with women that we have sent to him before and an immigration lawyer who can help with her immigration issues that she is having.
